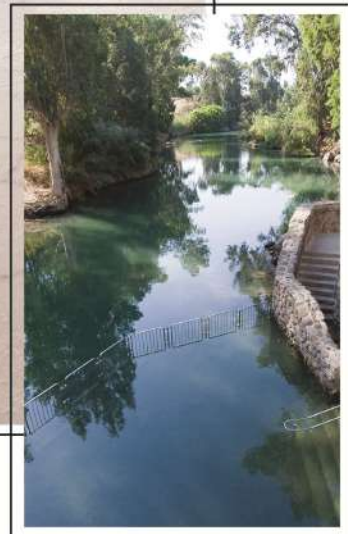
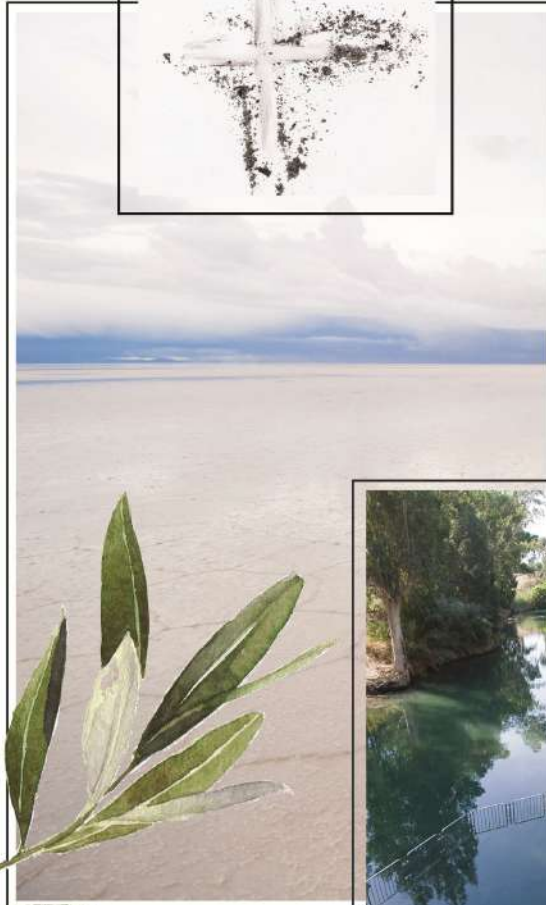

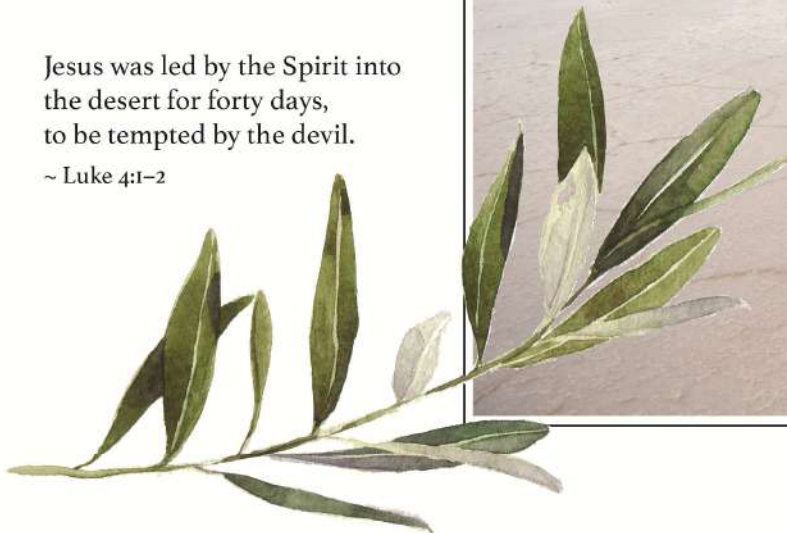

Lenten Reparation

This Lent, with the affects of the clergy abuse crisis weighing heavily on the hearts and minds of so many Catholics, some Catholic leaders have been encouraging the faithful to undertake our Lenten practices with an attitude of as reparation along with our usual sense of personal repentance. With personal repentance, we look into our lives and seek to repent of anything that is sinful, unholy, and not of Christ. Our penitential practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving are to help us to detach from earthly attractions, in order that we may grow spiritually. We seek, with Christ's grace, to become, ever more, free of the bonds of sin, in order that Christ may become more fully alive in us. Reparation is the sense of offering our spiritual practices, not for ourselves, but rather for someone else, to help free them from the bonds of their sin. It's not done with a sense of judgment of others, but rather of generosity for others who may have committed very serious sins. Just as we pray for others, we can humbly offer our penitential acts for those who may be in great spiritual need because of their sins. It can be a real challenge to pray, or to sacrifice personally for those who have done wrong. But that is precisely what Christ has done for us when he died on the cross, he offered himself for our sins. Our Lenten practices, such as prayer, and fasting can also be offered for the healing of victims who have suffered so terribly from the sins of others and almsgiving can literally be given to assist victims of any kind. Our small acts of reparation received by Christ and offered through him, perhaps can assist in some small way for the healing that is so desperately needed in our Church and world.

MARCH 10, 2019 LUKE 4:1-13

Sunday's Gospel reveals Jesus as fully human and fully divine. The devil tempts Jesus in the desert, promising Him human power and earthly goods. Jesus shows us how to resist temptation by holding tightly to the promises of God found in the Sacred Scripture.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK: What are some temptations that you experience? How does the Church help you to strengthen yourself against them?

FAMILY PRAYER: Pray the Lord's Prayer together. Focus on the words, "lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."

GOSPEL REFLECTION: Jesus refuses to turn stones to bread, to become a world-conquering warrior, or to jump from the temple and let angels catch Him. Jesus came among us to be our brother. In Him, we discover how God acts as a human being. Jesus comes among us to teach us our divine strengths, not to show off His own. He shows us that our greatest powers are loving, forgiving, sharing, and gathering people together.

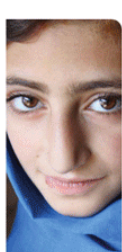
