FROM DEACON JOHN CLEVELAND

Father asked me to write about highlights from our recent pilgrimage to Northern France. Of course a highlight was to visit the home of St Therese of Lisieux, the patron saint of Kathy's and my home parish. To serve Mass in the very



chapel that The Little Flower prayed, and to vest in the sacristy that she acted as sacristan, and to visit her home and to see where she matured in her faith, all was truly stunning. The architecture of the churches, the beauty of the Normandy region and the influence Catholicism had on France for 1,000 years was captivating. Each day, serving mass in a chapel where Saints prayed; being inches from a piece of the Blessed Mother's veil worn in Bethlehem; seeing the femur bone of Mary Magdalene, and the incorrupt heart of St Vincent De Paul. All was spectacular. But maybe my most lasting memory from this great pilgrimage will be the 25 cent Miraculous Medal I wear around my neck. Last Monday I served Mass in the Chapel dedicated to Saint Catherine Laboure. Born in 1806, St Catherine was the ninth child in an upper middle class farming family. One day she had a dream where a priest told her she will care for the sick. Years later she joined the Daughters of Charity, founded by St Vincent DePaul, after recognizing St Vincent's picture as the priest in her dream years earlier. Catherine dedicated her life to caring for the sick and in prayer. In 1830 she was visited by the Blessed Mother three times. Each time the Blessed Mother told her that she wanted Catherine to have a medal struck in the exact image that Catherine saw her. If you look at a Miraculous Medal, you will see the image Catherine saw during the three visits. Soon after, the first two thousand medals were stamped with the Blessed Mother's image. Since then millions have circulated around the world, all with the promise the Blessed Mother gave Catherine. Our Mother promised "all who wear this medal will receive great graces; they should wear it around the neck. Graces will abound for persons who wear it with confidence and especially for those who ask for them." Catherine's incorrupt body is presently at rest just to the right of the altar I served at. She died 140 years ago, yet her body appears as beautiful as if she is asleep. Today I wear the Miraculous Medal, a simple reminder of Our Lady's promise to each of us who ask for her intercession with confidence. This simple medal, and the visit to this chapel honoring this beautiful soul, will be most memorable to me, and I am confident will bring abundant graces to those who wear it. St Catherine Laboure, pray for us. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us.

RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD: Today's readings invite us into prayer, into relationship with God. Because relationships feel more natural when we know one another well, Sirach encourages us to know God better. In his wisdom, Sirach tells us what God is like: fair, open-minded, compassionate, and attentive. "The Lord will not delay," he says. Knowing that God's help comes right on time, whenever we need it, calms our hearts and helps us trust the Lord. In his second Letter to Timothy, Saint Paul demonstrates his own trust in God. Despite the grueling struggles Saint Paul has faced because of his Christian faith, he praises the Lord for rescuing him time and again. Today's Gospel draws us close to Jesus too, revealing his special love for the poor and humble. 


