Pro-Life Sunday; It's about principle not feelings


The Sunday near January 22 traditionally has a focus on the importance and dignity of all human life from the moment of conception. That's because of the anniversary



of the January 22, 1973 Supreme Court ruling that legalized abortion in our country. Despite this "law of the land," the Church continues to faithfully proclaim the great value of every human life from conception until natural death. This is part of the "Good News" of the Gospel. Every person is made in the image and likeness of God. As Psalm 139 proclaims, "You formed me in my inmost being, you knit me in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am wonderfully made." A study has been in the news recently reporting that most women who have had abortions, do not feel emotions of regret later. The implication, of course, is that if the mother doesn't regret it, then it must be ok. But just because someone doesn't regret something, it does not mean that it is morally right. People are capable of doing all kinds of bad things without feeling regret. The better our conscience is formed, the better we are able to recognize what it right and good and to have true regret for the wrong that we have done. Our sense of right and wrong must be based on more than just feelings. It must be based on principle. It would be interesting to learn the opinions of the aborted children to hear what they think. They would probably beg to differ with the majority opinions expressed in the study. A faulty conscience is prone to err in determining the morality of any particular action. That is why we need the clear teachings of the Church to guide us. These are the teachings of Christ and they are not swayed by personal feelings and opinion. The Church's teaching on life issues is not about feelings, but rather of principle. It's the same reason why the church teaches against the death penalty, even though people often report feeling "relief" and "closure" when someone on death row is executed. The founding block of the Church's teaching rests upon the dignity of every human life. That's good news if you are a human being! It means that all have dignity and value. It means that you and I are valued and loved by God. It means that the child of the womb is valued as well as the mother who carries that child and the man who fathered the child. This is true and good teaching that is consistent and life affirming. It is part of the Good News of Jesus Christ who proclaimed, "I have come that they may have Life, and have it more abundantly". (John 10:10)



# SAN VICENTE (Siglo III)

# 22 de enero

San Vicente nació en Zaragoza, España y, debido a su buen uso de la palabra y formación académica, fue nombrado como coadjutor del obispo Valerio para que le ayudara en la predicación, pues el obispo era tartamudo. Una vez ordenado diácono se distinguió por la predicación elocuente y la defensa de la fe. Fue arrestado mientras visitaba a su obispo, preso a causa de la persecución impulsada por el emperador Daciano quien, al saber que visitó a su obispo mandó que lo apresaran, haciéndolo caminar desde Zaragoza hasta Valencia. Una vez preso se le sometió a la tortura, no obstante, la tortura no lograba nada y el emperador, lleno de ira, mandó que golpearan a los torturadores. Posteriormente le hizo encerrar en una celda oscura, llena de tiestos filosos para que se cortara sus pies, pero no renunció a su fe cristiana, convirtió al carcelero y cantó himnos de alabanza. Finalmente, puesto que nada lograba contra él, lo encarceló de por vida y ahí, en la soledad de su celda y sus enfermedades encontró la muerte.
