

We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.





Dear Parishioners and Friends,

It is very good to be back with you all. My time of recovery was a good time to give thanks for my dad being with me, taking walks with him at the Saint Nicholas Prayer Garden, giving thanks for all of the good things that God gave us at Saint Henry's. I wrote a lot of thank you notes.

I look forward to the time with you now that summer has gone, autumn is here, and my surgery is behind me. We will have a lot of opportunity to talk about our parish and find new ways to serve our Lord together. Thank you for completing the Disciple Maker Index Survey this past February. I want to share the results with you! This is not an exhaustive list of the results. I list the questions and the percentage of people who responded that the agree or strongly agree to the statement. I should note that we received 134 responses. 21 of these were under the age of 46 and 113 were over this age. 82 of the respondents were women and 52 were men. 129 respondents were Caucasian.

AIGÉSIMO SÉPTIMO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO 4 DE OCTUBRE DE 2020

Los viñedos eran una parte esencial de la economía de Israel durante los tiempos de Isaías y Jesús. Los propietarios de viñedos tenían el difícil desafío de producir una rica cosecha. Nuestras lecturas de Isaías y Mateo describen Dios y la creación de Dios en términos del negocio de los viñedos. Las dos historias están estrechamente vinculadas, ya que Jesús tomó prestada y adaptó su parábola de Isaías. Usando esta rica imaginería, podemos ver la viña como todos los lugares de la creación de Dios y el trabajo en curso. El viñedo es nuestro corazón, mente y cuerpo. El viñedo es nuestra familia, barrio y parroquia. La viña es la Iglesia y la sociedad, la humanidad y la tierra misma. Somos mayordomos en cada uno de estos viñedos, bendecidos para disfrutarlos, y responsables de su continua fecamiidad. Estamos llamados a unirnos a Dios en el cultivo de estos viñedos, para que produzcan una cosecha abundante.

MUY APASIONADO

Las historias de los viñedos en Isaías y en Mateo apuntan hacia una historia más amplia de Dios y del pueblo de Dios. Vemos que Dios es muy apasionado por nosotros. Dios está profundamente comprometido, como el dueño que diligentemente prepara el viñedo. Dios tiene expectativas muy altas que el viñedo produzca el fruto de una sociedad justa y compasiva. Dios (en la lectura de Isaías) está muy decepcionado y enojado que el viñedo haya producido un mal fruto, o (en la lectura de Mateo) que haya sido como un premio que deba ser confiscado.

Hay más capítulos en la historia más extensa que también necesitan ser contados. Después en Isaías y en Mateo vemos que Dios también es profundamente compasivo y muy dispuesto a perdonar. Isaías habla del cuidado compasivo de Dios, como una madre ama a sus hijos (Isaías 49). En Mateo, Jesús en la cruz demuestra de manera dramática el perdón de Dios. Por lo tanto, Dios es muy paciente y resilente. Dios nunca se da vencido por nosotros. Dios continúa persiguiéndonos, ofreciéndonos amor y gracia, ahora y siempre.

LA PIEDRA ANGULAR

Las extraordinarias conclusiones de las dos historias de los viñedos deben significar para nosotros su permanencia en nuestras memorias. Efectivamente, Dios espera mucho de nosotros, vivir de manera justa y misericordiosa. Sin embargo, sabemos que Dios no es susceptible e impaciente, así como podemos ser guiados a imaginar si leemos estas historias fuera de contexto. Las historias nos invitan a reflexionar una vez más en quién es Dios. Especialmente durante estos tiempos de dificultad o de fracasos en nuestras vidas, quizá podemos preguntarnos cómo podríamos entender mejor el misterio de Dios.

El testimonio del Nuevo Testamento es claro. Si quieres saber cómo es Dios, mira a

Jesús. Mira a su paciencia y misericordia. Mira a su compasión por el sufrimiento, su pasión por la justicia. Mira también a la alegría y experiencia sanadora de aquellos que están en su presencia. Así como el Evangelio de hoy indica, Jesús es la piedra angular, el punto de inicio para poder llegar a conocer a nuestro Dios.
