

We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

FROM THE PASTOR

The Most Holy Trinity

The Sunday after Pentecost is known as Trinity Sunday. "You worship three Gods" is a common criticism of Christianity. Our Triune God is amazing! But, do we worship three gods? Today's gospel reading provides an answer to that question. Some powerful things are said about Jesus here.

First, the man who died on the Cross is alive. He did really die, but he genuinely rose from the dead and passed beyond death in a life that has no end.

The disciples meet him and their adoration is mingled with doubt. They cannot comprehend it and yet it is true. They fall down before him, which is an action that is really appropriate only for God. Yet the words that Jesus says to them are unforgettable.

What does he say? "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me"? These words echo down through the centuries. They encompass all peoples for all ages. Only someone who is God can say these words. Only if Jesus is God can he pronounce these words without presumption. Only if Jesus is the Son of God can he have the right to ask us to become his disciples.

If an ordinary man were to expect all people on earth to become his followers, he would be grossly exaggerating his own importance. God, however, who created all things, can invite his creatures to trust him entirely. As we return to ordinary time, let us trust this man. Let us trust him entirely and follow in his ways, in all ways, always – he who is the Son of God.

CURSILLO IS COMING TO GA IN JUNE & JULY WHAT IS A CURSILLO WEEKEND?

The Cursillo Movement is introduced over a consecutive seventy-two-hour period called a "Three Day Weekend." During the three-day weekend, which begins Thursday evening and ends Sunday evening, a team of religious and lay personnel present a series of talks to the candidates and the entire group calls upon the Holy Spirit for enlightenment and guidance. The team and candidates live as a small Christian community over the weekend and discuss these talks in small groups. The discussions provide an opportunity to share insights about the presentations and hear how others received that same presentation. The talks and discussions cover a variety of topics including:

- The layperson's role within the Church
- Meaning of grace and sacraments
- Importance of prayer and the study of God
- Christian leadership and living Christianity in community.
- Our call to bring Christ to others and transform the very environments in which we live.
- The importance of supporting one another in our efforts to live a truly Christian life.

Throughout the weekend the participants will pray together, attend daily mass, and have an opportunity to receive the sacrament of reconciliation. Typically, by the end of the weekend, candidates have a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ and a better understanding of the power of the Holy Spirit. Also, candidates leave the weekend knowing that they have been called to spread the Word of God.


