Matrimony: Marriage preparation is required. Please call Father Tony VanderLoop, Pastor, at 952-679-9415 at least 8 months in advance.

Anointing: If you wish to receive an anointing please call the Parish Office: (952) 227-4000.

Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits:

Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.



GOD'S LIGHT HAS APPEARED

The Gospel for Christmas day is John 1:1-18. It is one of the most solemn texts of Holy Scripture: the so-called Prologue of John's Gospel. They are words that announce in stately language a mystery, the original mystery of the world; they are words illuminating the origin, meaning, and goal of everything.

John's words announce that "In the beginning was the Word". Beginning, as it is used here, means the original source from everything comes. God himself is this origin, and everything that exists has his mighty creative Word to thank for its existence.

John speaks of the Word being God's light. And this light enlightens everyone. The Word of God is, in this way, very near to every person. In the heart of every person there is this light, this spark of light, that always lights up when we understand something, when something "en-lightens" us. Christ is this light. He is the light that has always enlightened every person who sincerely seeks the true and the good.

And John says that the Word became flesh and dwelt among us. He came as a man to be our Savior and yet his light is not yet known to all. The light also meets with the resistance of darkness. Light and darkness are engaged in battle and have been at all times and in the heart of every person. The battle between light and darkness, however, was not to remain a draw and this is why God sent his light, his Word into the world. Many artists portray the child Jesus in such a way that all light radiates from him. God's original light shines for us in Jesus.

Light. Word. In the beginning. Word made flesh. We will have plenty of time to reflect on Jesus' teachings and mission. But before we do, Christmas is a great time to reflect on and be in awe of Jesus' identity and the Father's design. Take the time to read this gospel, even aloud, if you can, at Christmas. Blessings to you all!

Dear Parishioners,

If you are thinking of making year end gifts to the Parish, please consider these options:

- 1. You can donate appreciated stock and mutual funds directly to the Parish. If you choose to itemize your deductions, you receive the tax deduction as a charitable contribution for the full value of your donation. You also avoid paying tax on any gains, so there is a double benefit to you. Also, the Parish pays no tax either. It's a win-win and helps your donation go farther!
- For those of you age 72 and older, you can donate your annual Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your retirement account directly to the Parish. In this case it would not count as a charitable contribution but you avoid paying any income tax on this amount, and the Parish receives the full benefit.

OUR CHRISTMAS WISHLIST

Dear parishioners,

I wish you all a beautiful Christmas as we celebrate the coming of our Lord in history and in mystery and celebrate in hope for his coming again in majesty. Our parish depends on a good Christmas collection in order to provide for all the good things that a parish does to make our Lord, Jesus known and loved and to offer support for your activities and efforts as parishioners.

I thought that I would put together a wish list as we identify some specific areas in which you could help financially:

- 1. Upgrading our computers. At this time we are badly in need of doing so. Our current computers were primarily designated for school use, have limited memory capacity, and worn batteries. New computers will help enable our staff to be very productive. Quoted cost: \$10,500
- 2. Upgrading our internet access in the school and parish office. We anticipate utilizing the school and the parish office for the next five years as we discern the renovation of our buildings. We also anticipate greater internet use for our faith formation as materials integrated with video presentations are getting the best reviews from teachers and students. Currently, our wireless internet access needs better coverage throughout the entire building. Our wired internet infrastructure needs cleaning up to increase the supportability of the network.

Estimated cost: \$15,000 - \$20,000

- 3. Replacing our defibrillators in the gymnasium and in the Church. We are still assessing this need. Our defibrillators are quite dated, and it is difficult to obtain replacement parts for them. We may conclude that it is best to replace the defibrillators entirely. Estimated cost for Total Replacement: \$4,500
- 4. Providing a new Deacon's Chair. Currently, Deacon John uses a regular chair. However, Deacon's chairs, specially made like the presider's chair, are the norm for a Catholic Church sanctuary area. The design of the chair would be similar to our current presider's chair. Estimated cost: \$1,500

Thank you so much for all of your good stewardship and may God bless you and his parish this Christmas!
